## Elder abuse statistics in Queensland

### Year in Review 2024-2025

UnitingCare's Elder Abuse Prevention Unit produces research and reports related to elder abuse. Their key publication is the annual *Year in Review* report, which provides a detailed analysis of elder abuse occurring within family relationships throughout Queensland.

It includes insights into victims, perpetrators, notifiers, abuse patterns, referral pathways and much more. It has proven to be a strong advocacy tool to demonstrate what elder abuse is, as well as inform prevention and response strategies.

## Current news and updates

### 1800MEDICARE

You can now get free health information and advice anywhere in Australia, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, by calling 1800MEDICARE (1800 633 422).

If you're feeling unwell, caring for someone, or unsure whether to seek medical help, call 1800MEDICARE and a registered nurse will:

- listen to your concerns
- assess your symptoms
- advise on next steps—whether that's looking after yourself at home or getting help from a GP, Medicare Urgent Care Clinic, pharmacy or emergency department in your area.

### 2026 Free Flu Vaccination Program Queensland Health

On 6 February 2026, the Queensland Government announced the Queensland Free Flu Vaccination Program, which will ensure all Queensland residents from 6 months of age, including those without a Medicare card, can access free influenza vaccine from their preferred provider such as General Practices, pharmacies, or other community immunisation providers.

The 2026 Queensland Free Flu Vaccination Program will commence from 1 March 2026 and concludes on 30 September 2026.

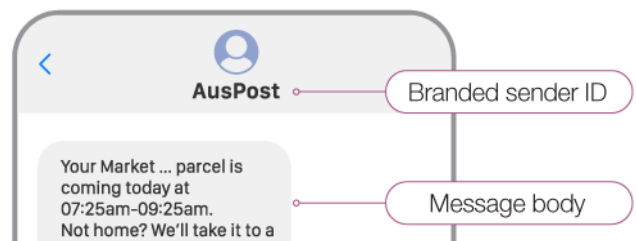

### SMS Sender ID Register Australian Communications and Media Authority

The way businesses and organisations send branded text messages is changing.

From 1 July 2026, new rules mean texts sent with an organisation's name at the top of a message (known as a branded sender ID) will need to have the sender ID registered.

A sender ID is the name at the top of text messages from businesses or organisations. It tells you who the message is from, like 'ATO', 'AusPost' or 'myGov'.



Businesses and organisations must register their sender IDs before 1 July 2026.

From then, text messages sent with unregistered sender IDs will have the sender ID replaced with the word 'Unverified'. These messages will be grouped together in a single message thread on a phone. People will likely treat unverified messages as scams.

## April No Falls Stay On Your Feet®

April No Falls, is a national and international campaign to educate and raise awareness of falls prevention and help those at risk of falling to stay on their feet. The overall campaign aim is to reduce falls and harm from falls.

Every day, 133 older Queenslanders have a fall requiring medical attention, even though falls are mostly preventable. Falls have a big impact on mobility and independence, but there are steps that can be taken to reduce the risk.

## World Elder Abuse Awareness Day 15 June 2026



World Elder Abuse Awareness Day (WEAAD) is a day to voice opposition to the abuse of older people. It is an annual initiative launched by the International Network for the Prevention of Elder Abuse and the World Health Organisation. WEAAD is commemorated each year on June 15 to highlight one of the worst manifestations of ageism and inequality in our society - elder abuse.

### What is elder abuse?

Elder abuse is a single or repeated act - or lack of appropriate action - occurring within any relationship where there is an expectation of trust, which causes harm or distress to an older person. The six abuse subtypes are commonly recognised as financial abuse, physical abuse, sexual abuse, psychological abuse (otherwise known as emotional abuse), social abuse and neglect.

### How to get involved

To show support, you may choose to wear **purple**, the official colour of WEAAD, on 15 June. Purple was chosen as it represents wisdom, dignity, independence and creativity. During the week of June 15, individuals and communities throughout Queensland will come together and show their support by hosting and attending a wide range of activities where people will have the opportunity to learn about elder abuse, its impacts and older people's human rights.

### Light up for WEAAD

1800 4 WOMEN (1800 496 636) is for women, by women - it's confidential, non-judgemental, and you don't need a referral.

You'll talk to the same qualified counsellor or midwife, and you can choose appointment times that work for you. There's no need to travel, and the service is completely free.

1800 4 WOMEN operates Monday-Friday 8-8pm, and Saturday 9-5pm.

They can help you with:

- Non-crisis mental health support
- Grief and loss counselling following miscarriage, stillbirth and neonatal death
- Midwifery support and advice
- Specialist domestic, family, and sexual violence counselling
- Referral services

## Senior Shopper Free telephone shopping service for Australian Seniors Card holders

Senior Shopper is a free shopping service that helps Seniors Card and Seniors Business Discount Card holders get the best price on a range of goods and services.

### SENIOR SHOPPER

Visit Senior Shopper's website [seniorshopper.com.au](http://seniorshopper.com.au) to get discounts on electrical and white-goods, travel, accommodation, new cars, gift cards, computers, furniture, car tyres and servicing, and more.

Discounted gift cards and e-gift cards are available from approximately 100 major retailers offering discounts of between 2% and 11% on items such as groceries, chemists, clothing, electrical, furniture, camping, movies, books and more.

### How to use Senior Shopper

1. Shop around, decide which item you want to buy and then contact Senior Shopper with the make, model and the best price you have found. Have your Seniors Card ready.
2. A Senior Shopper consultant will call you back, usually within two to three business hours, to advise you of the best price available at the time.
3. If you choose to buy the goods or services on offer, simply place your order with Senior Shopper. The preferred supplier will contact you to organise payment (by credit card, cash or cheque) and delivery.

## Smoke alarms

### New smoke alarm laws are coming on 1 January 2027

All existing private homes, townhouses, and units require interconnected photoelectric smoke alarms installed in every bedroom, connecting hallway and on each storey by 1 January 2027. All registered caravans and motorhomes must also be fitted with a photoelectric smoke alarm.

### Smoke Alarm Installation Program

Home Assist Secure (HAS) customers may qualify for a \$250 subsidy to install new smoke alarms or upgrade non-compliant ones. Eligible HAS customers can also use their annual HAS subsidy of \$500 to help pay for upgrades (labour and materials).

## What it's like to receive help from an aged care navigator and wellbeing officer

Margaret is an 82-year-old widow, living alone in her 3-bedroom house. While she valued her independence, everyday life had slowly become overwhelming to maintain. Cleaning her home left her exhausted, and some tasks had become impossible. Grocery shopping had become confusing, and she often worried about what the future might hold. She applied for My Aged Care with her doctor but had no idea where to go from there.

After speaking with a local service, Margaret was introduced to an Aged Care Navigator from Ageing Connections.

At their first meeting, they sat together over a cup of tea and talked about Margaret's life, her routines and what she felt she needed. There was no pressure, no rush - just time to listen, build trust and understand what mattered most to Margaret.

Margaret shared that she was beginning to feel unsafe living alone and was interested in exploring retirement living but had no idea what to do. She also wanted help at home and someone to walk alongside her during day-to-day outings and appointments.

Margaret's navigator supported her to explore suitable retirement living options, coordinated appointments and attended viewings with her. They explained each step clearly, handled the behind-the-scenes phone calls and paperwork and made sure Margaret was always informed and involved without feeling overwhelmed.

At the same time, she was assisted to find a suitable home care support provider with the aged care navigator even organising a meet and greet with a potential support worker for Margaret to ensure they were a good fit.

With ongoing navigation support, Margaret successfully moved into retirement living and commenced receiving in-home support which suited her needs. By receiving support to navigate every step, this ensured the transition felt as smooth and stress-free as possible.

Once settled, Margaret chose to remain connected with Ageing Connections' wellbeing team. She now receives a weekly phone call check-in for a friendly chat - something she looks forward to each week.

Margaret says the biggest difference for her was knowing she didn't have to manage everything alone. She felt supported, informed and reassured throughout the entire journey. With support in place and regular social connection, Margaret feels calmer, more confident, and more hopeful about the future.

# Emily's scams prevention corner

## Scam door knockers QPS Moreton Bay Crime Prevention

In recent years, scam doorknockers have become an increasing concern for communities across Queensland.

These individuals often pose as legitimate salespeople, charity workers, or service providers to gain access to your home or personal information. While many door-to-door interactions are genuine, it's important to stay vigilant and protect yourself from potential scams.

### How to protect yourself:

- Ask for identification - always request to see official identification, if they claim to represent a company or charity, ask for their name and contact details, then verify their credentials by contacting the organisation directly, using a trusted source for contact details.
- Don't feel pressured - take your time to make decisions, if someone is pressuring you, it's okay to say no and close the door.
- Never share personal information - avoid giving out personal details like your bank account, credit card info or Medicare number.
- Don't let them inside - unless you're absolutely sure of their identity and purpose, do not invite strangers into your home.
- Trust your instincts - if something makes you uncomfortable, ask them to leave and close the door.

### Stay informed and stay safe.

Scam doorknockers often target vulnerable individuals, including seniors and those living alone. By staying informed and sharing this information with family, friends and neighbours, you can help protect your community from falling victim to these scams.

## Replacement Medicare Card scams Services Australia

Scammers are pretending to be from Medicare and myGov.

They may contact you by text message and say:

- your Medicare card needs to be replaced
- your Medicare card has been temporarily suspended
- you need to go to an online portal to complete the process
- your online services may be suspended if you don't replace your card.
- They may tell you to reply with a 'Y' to activate the link in the text message, or to copy and paste the link into your web browser.

Don't respond or go to these suspicious websites.

You should contact your financial institution immediately if you have given your financial details to a scammer.

Services Australia won't ask you to:

- reply to them by text message or email
- click on or copy and paste a link in a text message or email
- give your bank card details to get a replacement Medicare card
- pay for a new Medicare card to be sent to you in the mail.

If your Medicare card is about to expire, you don't need to do anything. Medicare send a new card about 4 to 8 weeks before it expires.
