Stay Safe when Shopping Online

The amount of money spent by consumers increases at Christmas time. Over recent years, more and more of this shopping has been done online, leading to an increase in online shopping fraud. It is important to be aware of common online shopping scams and how to protect yourself from these scammers.

Scamwatch reports that the common online shopping scams are:

- Classified scams items are advertised but the fake seller has no intention of ever providing the goods once they are paid for.
- Fake retailer websites the websites look like other "real" shopping websites and may include stolen logos.
- Online auctions goods are posted on auction websites but the seller tries to arrange a private deal outside of the auction site.

The Australian Federal Police have an <u>online shopping factsheet</u> with tips for shopping safely online and the Queensland Police have brochures about <u>shopping on the net</u> and <u>e-crime</u>. The <u>Scamwatch</u> <u>website</u> also has information about warning signs to help you spot online shopping scams. Free Shingles Vaccine

Shingles is a virus often characterised by a painful skin rash on one side of the face or body. Shingles can result in nerve pain that lasts for months or even years. One in three people will develop shingles over their lifetime, with the risk increasing as a person gets older.

From November 2016, people 70 years of age may be able to receive the Shingles vaccine Zostavax, free of charge. Until 31 October 2021, 71-79 year olds will also be able to access the free vaccine as part of a catch-up program. The free vaccine can be accessed by visiting your local doctor or vaccination clinic.

The vaccine is free, however your GP may charge a consultation fee. If you would like more information about the free vaccine, contact the Immunise Australia Information Line on **1800 671 811**.

ADA Australia has produced the *2017 Legal Topics for Older People Diary*. Designed for older people, it is a valuable resource that provides access to vital legal information in a handy diary.

The topics covered in the diary include: Aged care, the NDIS, retirement villages, future planning, funerals and wills, elder abuse, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander information, neighbours and housing, carers, mental health, consumer issues and finance. Puppy Raising Program

Guide Dogs Queensland is searching for seniors interested in becoming puppy raisers. The puppies are cared for from 8 weeks of age, until they begin formal training at 15-18 months. Raising a puppy requires significant time contribution, however the experience can be

very satisfying. Studies have shown that having a pet can have additional benefits such as improvements in physical and psychological health, increased social interaction and a greater sense of well-being.



The Puppy Raising Program may be suitable for people who live within 1

2G Network Shutting Down

Telstra, Optus and Vodafone are shutting down their 2G mobile phone networks over the next year. The dates for shutdown are:

- Telstra 1 December 2016
- Optus 1 April 2017
- Vodafone 30 September 2017



If you will be affected by the shutdown, you should have been contacted by

your network provider. You can also check the top of your phone screen for a 2G, GPRS, Edge or E icon. If your phone has any of these symbols, you will need to contact your mobile phone network provider. If your phone shows 3G, H+, 4G, or LTE, you will not be affected by the shutdown.

If your phone is still running on the 2G network, you may need to upgrade your SIM card, upgrade your mobile device or update your device settings before the network shuts down. If you are going to be affected, contact your network provider for more information about what steps you might need to take. If your SIM card needs to be replaced, your network provider may be able to post it out to you. If you do need to purchase a new phone, 3G compatible handsets start at around \$30.
