U3A (University of the Third Age) promotes healthy ageing by sharing educational, creative and leisure activities. U3A is a worldwide provider of adult education programs for seniors. The courses encompass subjects such as: computing, languages, travel, the arts, history, physical fitness activities and many more. There are currently 33 U3A groups in Queensland, with around 21,000 members.

U3A does not require any qualifications for membership and there are no exams; it's learning for the joy of learning. Courses can be accessed through your local U3A group or courses are available online. U3A courses are available at little or no cost, however a small yearly membership fee is payable. Energy and water affordability is a challenge for everyone, but particularly for those on lower incomes. Reducing the amount of money spent on energy and water can help to take the pressure off the budget and free up money for other things.

Door-to-Door Traders

Door-to-door traders often come around offering to sell goods or services. Buying from a door-to-door trader may be convenient but you can often feel pressured into buying goods or services that you don't need or want. Some door-to-door traders use unscrupulous practices to pressure people into buying their products or services and some have no intention of ever providing you with the goods or service after you pay for it.

If you do buy goods or services from an unsolicited door-to-door trader and change your mind, you have a 10 business day cooling-off period during which you can cancel any contract you have signed, without penalty.

If you do not wish for door-to-door traders to visit your house, you can display a "Do Not Knock" sticker at your front gate or front door. If you would like a "Do Not Knock" sticker posted out to you, you can order one from the Fair Trading website or by phoning Seniors Enquiry Line on **1300 135 500**.

No Interest Loans

The No Interest Loan Scheme (NILS) provides access to safe, fair and affordable credit to individuals and families on low incomes. NILS loans may be for

amounts between \$300 and \$1200 for essential goods or services such as: household items like whitegoods or furniture, education items (computers, text books), some medical or dental



services, or other essential items. The repayments are set at an affordable amount over 12-18 months.

To be eligible for a NILS loan, you must have a Health Care Card/Pension Card or be on a low income (less than \$45,000 a year after tax), have lived at your current address for more than 3 months and show a willingness and capacity to repay the loan. Free Fire and Safety Check

The Queensland Fire and Emergency Services has a free Safehome program available to all Queensland residents who are concerned with improving safety in their home. If you request a Safehome check, firefighters will visit to help you to identify potential fire and safety hazards in and
