Pension Increase

Following indexation linked to Consumer Price Index, the maximum Age Pension for single

people is now \$867 a fortnight (a rise of \$6.80 per fortnight), and for couples combined it is \$1,307 (a rise of \$10.20 per fortnight for a couple).

There are also increases to other payments, and small increases to Rent Assistance and some other supplementary payments. Full details of rates and thresholds which date from 20 September can be found at www.dss.gov.au/benefits-

Cybercrime Online Reporting Network

The Australian Cybercrime Online Reporting Network (ACORN) is a government policing initiative. It is a national online system that allows the public to securely report instances of cybercrime. It also provides advice to help recognise and avoid common types of cybercrime, as well as advice for those who have fallen victim.

Common forms of cybercrime include hacking, online scams, online fraud, identity theft, attacks on computer systems, and illegal or prohibited online content. ACORN makes reporting cybercrime easier and more convenient for all Australians.

Home Care Packages

From 1 July 2015, all Home Care Packages are being delivered on a Consumer

Directed Care (CDC) basis. CDC means:

• you have more say in the care and services you access, how it is delivered and who delivers it

you will have conversations about your needs and goalsyou will work in partnership



with your service provider to develop your care plan

• you agree to the level of involvement you will have in managing your care package

• you will have a greater understanding about how your package is funded and how those funds are spent through your individualised budget and monthly income and expense statement

• your service provider will monitor and provide you with ongoing formal reviews to ensure that your package still meets your needs.

CDC allows you to exercise more choice in what services are delivered and where and when they are delivered. If your needs change you can have a reassessment to see if you need to change your package.

If your needs cannot be met using your Home Care Package budget, then you may need to be reassessed to see if you are eligible for a higher level of package, or use your own money to top up the service.
