## **Paper Bills Exemption**

Did you know that if you are getting paper bills you may be getting charged for them?

Most utility companies (electricity, phone etc) can usually send you a bill electronically or in the mail.

If you are able to go paperless that's great, but if not then you can still get them posted but you may be charged a fee.

You can usually get an exemption from the fee if you are a senior.

So contact your utility company and see if you are eligible - ask the question and have the fee removed.

Officers are a wealth of information and there are 10 – 15 nationally in Australia.



Purchasing a dog is a big decision and one that is generally very emotional.

Unfortunately there are scammers out there that are prepared to prey on our emotions at this time. There are also unscrupulous people out there that overbreed or keep animals in appalling conditions, sometimes referred to as Puppy Farms.

In Queensland, all breeders or suppliers of dogs must be registered on the Queensland Dog Breeder Register and will have a unique number known as the Breeder ID or supply number. The supply number must be provided when a dog is given away, sold or advertised. This number is also registered on the dog's micro chip.

You can confirm the supply number on the Queensland Dog Breeder Register or report a concern regarding a breeder on their website <a href="www.qdbr.daf.qld.gov.au">www.qdbr.daf.qld.gov.au</a> or by calling 13 25 23. We can also send you a brochure on the dog breeder Register Flyer – just call and ask. However if you are considering a dog check out our article on senior pets.
