Congratulatory Letters

If you or someone you know is celebrating a special birthday or anniversary, you can request a congratulatory letter from the Premier of Queensland, Prime Minister of Australia, Governor-General or Her Majesty The Queen to mark the occasion.



For 90th birthdays a request can be made for a letter from the Prime Minister and the Premier of Queensland and for 100th, 105th and 110th birthdays, letters can be requested from Her Majesty The Queen, the Governor-General of Australia, the Prime Minister of Australia, the Governor of Queensland and the Premier of Queensland.

For a 50th (Golden) Anniversary, letters can be requested from the Prime Minister of Australia, the Premier of Queensland and the Governor of Queensland. For 60th (Diamond) Anniversaries requests can be made for letters to be sent from Her Majesty The Queen, the Governor-General of Australia, the Prime Minister of Australia, the Governor of Queensland and the Premier of Queensland. Considerations can be made under special circumstances for both anniversaries and birthdays.

DO NOT CALL REGISTER



The Do Not Call Register is a secure database where individuals and organisations can register, check or remove their Australian telephone, mobile and fax numbers to opt out of receiving most unsolicited

telemarketing calls and faxes. Registration is free and you only need to do it once. Once registered, the number will stay on the register indefinitely unless the number owner or their representative removes the number. Influenza Vaccination

Given that summer is now officially over, it is timely to remind everyone that all people over the age of 65 are able to receive a free influenza vaccine, as they are in the heightened risk



group, amongst others. To receive your influenza vaccination, visit your local doctor or immunisation provider. It is important to note that while the vaccine is free, a consultation fee with your doctor may apply.

CPI Increase

As of 20 March 2017, a change in the age pension amount has occurred to keep in line with the CPI (Consumer Price Index). The rate of increase has been deemed at 1.3%, which is an extra \$11.20 per fortnight for singles and \$16.80 per fortnight for couples.

Advanced Health Directive Forms

An Advanced Health Directive is a document in which you give instructions about your future health care. It includes directions about the withdrawal and withholding of life sustaining measures in particular circumstances. It comes into effect only if you are unable to make your own decisions. People who are seriously ill are often unconscious or unable to communicate their wishes - at the very time when many critical decisions need to be made. Also known as "The Living Will", the Health Care Directive can take pressure of friends and loved ones because they are fully aware of your wishes.

It has been discovered that the Advanced Health Directive form is no longer available from many post offices. Queries made by the Seniors Enquiry Line suggest that some newsagents still stock them, however there may be a cost of up to \$9.50. If this is your preferred option then it may be best to contact your local newsagent. The form is also available on the internet, free of charge at:
