Your Medical Alarm and the NBN network

The NBN network will replace most existing phone and internet networks and involves new technologies that may not be compatible with your medical alarm device. If you have a medical alarm, it's important that you register it with the NBN and call the medical alarm provider for advice. Make sure you do this well before the existing land line is replaced and the NBN comes in. You may be eligible for an upgrade at a reduced cost for an unmonitored alarm but criteria applies. Pocket Profile

Medication list in an emergency?

AVAILABLE from pharmacies and small enough to fit in a wallet or purse, the Pocket Profile is an invaluable tool which contains details of the medications you are taking.

The card, which is prepared by your local pharmacist, can prove to be vital to your wellbeing if you find yourself in strife at home, near home, interstate or even overseas.

It contains your current medication profile, an emergency contact number, your doctor's name and pharmacy contact details.

The information is printed by the pharmacist on an A5 sized document which, with its perforations, folds into a business sized card.

The card is given to patients when they have a Webster pack but can be requested by your pharmacist even if you don't use the Webster pack system.

Did you know that Queensland has more than 8000 Native flowering plants and species and more than

1400 non flowering plant species? In fact new species are being documented at a rate of 20 per year in QLD!! The most recognisable are the wattle, eucalyptus, lily pilly and melaleuca



species. There is a group called "Native Plants Queensland" and their aim is to preserve Australian native flora by promoting its introduction into gardens, improve existing species through breeding and selection as well as encouraging nurseries to propagate and supply natives to the public.
