# **Untouched Bank Accounts**

Do you have a bank account that has been untouched for over 3 years?

There have been changes to the Commonwealth unclaimed money laws, so that from 31st May 2013, if you have not deposited or withdrawn money from a bank account for a period of 3 years (previously 7 years), it may be identified as unclaimed, and be transferred to the Commonwealth of Australia Consolidated Revenue Fund.

To ensure your account is kept active, you only need to deposit or withdraw money -5 cents will do! - in under 3 years.

If your account is closed and transferred to Consolidated Revenue, it is always claimable by the rightful owner, and from 1 July 2013, interest will also be payable. To find out if there is unclaimed money for you to claim, you can do a free search of unclaimed money records held by ASIC through the MoneySmart website: www.moneysmart.gov.au

For more information, talk with your bank, or go to <u>www.asic.gov.au</u> and type 'unclaimed money' in the search box at the top of the page. Otherwise you can phone ASIC on 1300 300 630.

# **Fire Safety in Winter**

As there are typically more house fires throughout the winter months, seniors are urged to take preventative measures as follows:

Have a working smoke alarm

• Check that appliances such as heaters and electric blankets are in good working order. Almost 400,000 potentially faulty electric blankets and 41,000 potentially faulty heaters were

*r*erecalled last year. To make sure yours isn't one of them, find your model and product number, then check the Recalls Australia website <u>www.recalls.gov.au</u> or phone Seniors Enquiry Line on 1300 135 500.

• Have a fire extinguisher and fire blanket in the kitchen and know how to use them.

• Clear away food crumbs and scraps from cooking appliances, and keep electrical appliances away from water and open flames. Never use water on fat or oil fires. Kitchen fires are especially dangerous as they start and can spread quickly.

• Check the filter of a clothes dryer before every load.
