Transport Help

If you want to stay in your own home, but need help getting to and from shops, medical appointments, etc within the community, then transport services may be available, generally at a small cost.

Seniors Enquiry Line can provide details of any community transport available in your area, and also details about Taxi Subsidy, Patient Travel Subsidy Scheme, Council Cabs (for shopping), Disability Parking Permits, Senior Card+ go, and more. Phone 1300 135 500 for information.

For seniors and people with disabilities living in **greater north Brisbane** (north of the Brisbane River), Pine Rivers, North Lakes and Redcliffe, St John Ambulance (Qld) Social Services can provide non-urgent assisted door-to-door transport to various appointments, shopping and activities. Budget Changes

Seniors Enquiry Line has had many queries about the changes to the budget, and the following details should answer some of them.

The changes may not all be passed by the Senate, which will sit in July 2014. At present there is the possibility that the \$7 co-payment to see a GP and for pathology and diagnostic imaging services may not pass, as well as some other measures.

• Changes to **Pensions** will mostly occur from 2017. From September 2017, index changes mean that the value of the pension will decrease every six months in comparison to wages. Also, there will be changes to the income and assets tests making it harder for some people to qualify for a payment. For people who have savings, the deeming thresholds will also be reduced. The pension age will eventually increase to 70.

• The **pension supplement** will not be affected, except that the Clean Energy Supplement component will no longer increase with CPI after June 30, 2014.

• **Concessions** in such areas as electricity, motor vehicle registration, public transport etc may be cut, as the Federal Government has cut payments for concessions to the states. It will be up to the State Government whether concessions will continue or not.

• Those people not eligible for pensions, but eligible for the **Commonwealth Seniors Health Card**, will lose the Seniors Supplement, (currently \$876.20 per year for singles and \$1,320.80 for couples) after their June payment, although the Clean Energy Supplement (to be renamed the Energy Supplement) will stay, at \$88.71 for singles and \$134.02 for couples, per year. There will also be changes to eligibility for this card.

• If the \$7 **co-payment** passes the Senate, it will start from 1 July 2015. Pensioners and other concession card holders will have the fee waived after the first 10 visits per year (including pathology & diagnostic imaging).

• Increase in prescription costs and safety net thresholds – **scripts** go up by \$5, or \$0.80 with concession cards.

• **Optometrists** providing Medicare eligible services will be able to determine their own fees.

• **Fuel costs** will increase due to a return to indexing the fuel excise.

• The Housing Help for Seniors program won't proceed.

Brisbane City Council (BCC) is inviting residents to participate in the Green Heart Wisdom program which aims to help Brisbane's over 60s to save on power bills.
