



Pension Increase last March

Seniors Enquiry Line has had enquiries about the pension increase from 20 March this year. The details are: single pensioners receive \$6.90 more a fortnight, while couples receive an extra \$10.40 a fortnight.

There are also increases in Rent Assistance, Newstart Allowance, Widow Allowance, Partner Allowance, and Sickness Allowance.

Adult rates of pensions and allowances are adjusted twice a year, in March and September, and are linked to both prices and wages.

Flu Vaccine

A new four-strain flu vaccine, protecting against the nasty Brisbane virus, is now available. The flu vaccine is recommended for everyone from six months of age, but is available **free** under the National Immunisation Program for people who face a high risk from influenza and its complications.



Those at risk include people over 65 years of age, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples aged 15 yrs or older, and anyone who has a medical condition such as severe asthma, lung or heart disease, low immunity or diabetes that can lead to complications from influenza.

Even if the vaccine is free, you may need to pay for a visit to your GP to have the injection.

Blue Knot Foundation, formerly Adults Surviving Child Abuse (ASCA), is the leading national organisation working to improve the lives of the 1 in 4 adult Australians (5 million) who have experienced childhood trauma. Childhood trauma stems from overwhelming negative experiences in early life, including sexual, emotional, physical abuse and neglect.

Many struggle day to day with their self-esteem, relationships, mental and physical health and numerous aspects of everyday life. Trauma in childhood does not only affect those who have experienced it. It affects their family, including their children and their communities. Without help, the effects can last a lifetime.

Blue Knot Foundation provides telephone counselling support, information, fact sheets and other resources, tools and workshops to help survivors and their friends and families.
